The silent catalogs run between 70 and 100 pages generally and many people bid on only a handful of items. Customers will be able to search the catalog, find the items they are interested in and print those select pages and bring them to the office with them to make additional notes during preview. Bid forms are also downloadable and can even be filled out online and emailed.

We understand that people generally are resistant to change and because our consignor's interests are paramount, we will monitor silent auction activity and we will listen to all of those with respectful comments, suggestions and ideas.

GENERAL STATEMENTS

- The Silent Auction is by absentee bidding only. Absentee bidders must register by filling out and signing an absentee bid sheet.
- The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall become the owner upon the fall of the hammer. The auctioneer has sole discretion in the case of a dispute among bidders.
- Amoskeag Auction Company, Inc. has taken great care in the preparation of the descriptions in this catalog. Although we believe everything in the descriptions to be true, we do not guarantee any part of any description. We recommend that the bidders view the items in person and form their own opinions as to condition, originality, origin, etc. Amoskeag Auction Company, Inc. will consider all requests for refunds. If a customer is unhappy with a purchase we will be happy to discuss a remedy with them.
- Amoskeag Auction Company, Inc. reserves the right to reject any bid in order to protect our consignors interests.
- Bidding on any item in the sale indicates the bidder's full acceptance and understanding of all terms and conditions of sale.

PAYMENT POLICY

- Amoskeag Auction Company, Inc. will accept cash, check, MasterCard, Visa, and American Express as payment for items purchased by those customers who attend the sale. GUIDELINES FOR FIREARM PURCHASES

- All Federal, State and Local firearms laws will be observed. FFL holders may take possession of any firearm on day of sale when they present a signed copy of their Federal Firearms License. New Hampshire residents over the age of 21 may take possession of any firearm on day of sale providing the proper paperwork is filled out and the transfer has been approved either through the NH State Police or the FBI NICS System. While most NICS and State approvals are immediate, approvals could take up to 3 days. Most non-residents may take possession of long guns on day of sale after completing the proper forms and successfully completing a NICS check; modern handguns will need to be shipped to an FFL holder in the buyer's home state. Buyer is responsible for any and all shipping charges and all items must be paid for on day of sale. Bidders should be familiar with their local and state laws.

Firearms are marked as follows:

ANTIQUÉ - no paperwork required

C&R - for firearms that fall under the ATF Curio & Relics licensing and if purchased by a person with a "C&R License" no paperwork is required. **NOTE:** Items that meet the age requirements but have been altered from their original configuration may NOT be delivered on a C&R License.

Firearms that are not marked with one of these notations are considered to be "MODERN" and all proper paperwork is required unless you are an FFL Dealer.

1000. BROWN MANUFACTURING COMPANY SOUTHERNER DERINGER PISTOL

serial #4, 41 RF, 2 1/2" octagon barrel with a fair bore. The barrel is an even mix of speckled smooth brown oxidation and smooth pewter patina; there are some minor dings on its underside. The frame exhibits sharp edges and is a dull ocher patina. The smooth rosewood grips rate about very good and appear to have been lightly cleaned, they are pencil-numbered to the gun; both grip screws show slot damage. The extractor is damaged on this example and the



barrel pivots somewhat sluggishly. The mechanism works well however with a strong hammer spring. The pistol is completely unmarked. (36229-464) {ANTIQUE} [Elliott Riggs Collection] (400/600)


1001. BROWN MANUFACTURING COMPANY SOUTHERNER DERINGER PISTOL

serial #35, 41 RF, 2 1/2" octagon barrel with a fair bore. The barrel is an even mix of plum brown and a dull gun metal gray showing some minor dings and light pinprick pitting. The frame exhibits very slightly softened edges and is a dull ocher patina. The smooth grips appear to be walnut and rate good, now devoid of varnish and showing some raised grain, they are un-marked; both grip screws show slot damage. The barrel pivots freely and the mechanism works well however one must be very positive with the hammer to get it to catch. The pistol is completely unmarked. 1002. BROWN MANUFACTURING COMPANY SOUTHERNER DERINGER PISTOL

serial #5913, 41 RF, 2 1/2" octagon barrel with a poor bore. The barrel is a speckled light brown oxidation with light freckling and pinprick pitting, it is marked "Southerner" on its top flat. The frame exhibits softened edges and is a dull ocher patina. The smooth rosewood grips rate good as refinished, they are now under size to the frame and are stamp-numbered to the gun; both grip screws show slot damage. The extractor is missing on this example and the barrel pivots freely. The mechanism works well however with a strong hammer spring. (36229-450) {ANTIQUE} [Elliott Riggs Collection] (300/400)



1003. BROWN MANUFACTURING COMPANY SOUTHERNER DERINGER PISTOL

serial #2408, 41 RF, 2 1/2" octagon barrel with a poor bore. The metal surfaces are an overall plum brown patina with pewter undertones, especially on the sharp edges, one or two areas showing small remnants of original nickel plate. The smooth rosewood grips rate good and appear to have been lightly cleaned, they are stamp-numbered to the gun; both grip screws show slot damage. The barrel pivots freely and the mechanism needs some mechanical attention as it does not cock appropriately and the hammer spring is weak. The pistol is "Southerner" marked on its top flat with Brown Manufacturing marking on left flat. (36229-427) {ANTIQUE} [Elliott Riggs Collection] (250/400)




1004. MANHATTAN FIREARMS COMPANY NAVY TYPE PERCUSSION REVOLVER


serial #25692, .36 cal. percussion, 5" octagon barrel with an about very good bore. The metal surfaces are an overall soft plum brown patina with light oxidation and sparse pinprick pitting; also showing minor dings and handling marks from the years, the muzzle slightly flared from being dropped. The five shot, 10 stop cylinder panels are still visible, the scenes within are not, but the barrel markings are still clear. The strap and triggerguard have faded to a goldenrod patina showing some generous traces of silver plate at the triggerguard, perhaps 10% remaining. The smooth one-piece walnut grip rates very good with much original varnish, worn on the sharp edges of the butt, the right side with a small chip; it is pencil-numbered to the gun. All the numbers are matching but the cylinder number is not discernible and there is no barrel wedge present, a common piece of flat steel currently holds barrel to frame. The gun is not mechanically functional and will not cock; the cylinder does index but does not lock up. Overall a good "example" of a type III for the budding Manhattan collector. 
1005. **MANHATTAN FIREARMS COMPANY PERCUSSION PEPPERBOX PISTOL** serial #77, .28 cal. percussion, 3" six-shot barrel cluster with oxidized bores. The metal surfaces are an overall dull gun metal gray with scattered brown oxidation staining and some sparsely scattered light pits, also showing some minor impact marks and dings from the years. The nipples are shrouded and the rounded frame flats show some very loose scroll engraving. The barrel cluster is marked with the manufacturer's name and address between the flutes, the bar hammer is unmarked. The bag-shaped walnut grips rate good with some remnants of original varnish and minor dings and handling marks they are stamp-numbered to the gun. The hammer will function appropriately and the barrel cluster will rotate however the trigger does not always return. Overall an about very good example of a six-shot Manhattan pepperbox. 1006. **LONDON PISTOL COMPANY POCKET MODEL PERCUSSION REVOLVER** serial #1414, .31 cal percussion, 4" octagon barrel with an about very good bore showing strong seven-groove rifling but with minor oxidation and some light pitting. The barrel and cylinder are primarily a soft gray-brown with minor oxidation staining and some sparse light pitting. The barrel and loading lever show some scant traces of what appears to be silver plate in the more protected areas and the cylinder scene is fully visible although somewhat light in areas. The frame is more of a gray-pewter patina with the sideplate toned to brown, the loose flowing scroll engraving still fully evident. The smooth burl walnut grips rate very good with much original varnish and light dings and handling marks, they are un-numbered. The gun will cock and index but it would appear as though there is no cylinder stop present. The barrel, wedge and frame numbers match, there is no evident number on the cylinder. An about good 5-shot series I London Pistol Company revolver overall. (36229-1) {ANTIQUÉ} [Elliott Riggs Collection] (350/550)



1007. **RARE EARLY MANHATTAN FIREARMS MANUFACTURING POCKET MODEL PERCUSSION REVOLVER** serial #66, .31 cal percussion, 4" octagon barrel with a fair to about good bore showing seven-groove rifling with minor oxidation and some light pitting. The metal surfaces are an overall soft brown patina with oxidation and scattered pinprick pitting. There are a number of minor handling marks here and there, most prevalent around the wedge. The smooth walnut grips rate good and are likely lightly cleaned many years ago. They retain light dings and handling marks and are un-numbered. This early developmental model features a solid arbor with open-top wedge slot through-which the wedge passes. The five-shot, five-stop cylinder was made without a roll-engraved scene. The gun will function mechanically, albeit somewhat loosely. The frame retains the loose flowing scroll engraving on the flats and backstrap, still quite vivid. The barrel, cylinder and frame numbers match, there is no evident number on the wedge which is likely a hand-made replacement; the barrel is slightly bent in relation to its fit with the frame. A few of the screw heads show some slot damage but this is an interesting, very early series I pocket model overall. (36229-3) {ANTIQUÉ} [Elliott Riggs Collection] (400/600)




1008. **NEPPERHAN FIREARMS COMPANY POCKET MODEL PERCUSSION REVOLVER** serial #1905, .31 cal percussion, 4 1/4" octagon barrel with a fair-poor bore showing pitting its full length. The metal surfaces are dull pewter gray patina with overall light brown oxidation speckling and some scattered light pitting. The barrel address is still legible, there is no evidence of a cylinder scene. The cylinder itself shows some more frequent pitting and a number of small dings and handling marks from the years; the triggerguard has toned to a dull ocher patina. The smooth walnut grips rate good to about very good, they are now devoid of varnish and have small dings and handling marks, the right grip missing a tiny chip. The gun functions surprisingly well mechanically although some of the screw heads show some slight slot damage. The numbers are all matching including the wedge. A good to about very good example overall of these Yonkers New York-made revolvers, period competitors of the Bacon and Manhattan Companies. 
1009. **MANHATTAN FIREARMS COMPANY BAR HAMMER SINGLE SHOT PERCUSSION PISTOL** serial #567, .31 cal. percussion, 3" part octagon part round barrel with a very good bore. The metal surfaces are an overall bright gun metal gray with some scattered light brown oxidation staining. The frame shows some fading loose flowing scroll engraving. The bag-shaped walnut grips rate about very good with some light dings and some oxidation staining leaching in from the steel. The bar hammer is marked with the manufacturer's name and address. There is some scattered pitting around the flash areas of the nipple however the arm seems to function well. (36229-127) {ANTIQUÉ} [Elliott Riggs Collection] (300/400)

1010. **MANHATTAN FIREARMS COMPANY BAR HAMMER SINGLE SHOT PERCUSSION PISTOL** serial #82, .31 cal. percussion, 2" part octagon part round barrel with an oxidized bore. The metal surfaces are an overall smooth and soft brown with pewter undertones showing areas of minor oxidation, the round portion of the barrel with some light radial turned marks. The frame shows some loose flowing scroll engraving which is still quite vivid. The bag-shaped walnut grips rate about very good with some strong traces of original varnish and only light dings and handling marks, they are pencil-numbered to the gun. The bar hammer is marked with the manufacturer's name and address. There is some scattered pitting around the flash areas of the nipple and the arm seems to function well. A neat little pocket-size bar hammer Manhattan. (36229-54) {ANTIQUÉ} [Elliott Riggs Collection] (300/400)

1011. **MORGAN & CLAPP PIVOT BREECH SINGLE SHOT POCKET PISTOL** serial #89, 22 RF, 2 7/8" octagon barrel with an about very good bore. The barrel is primarily a soft brown patina showing a few flecks of original blue with some minor oxidation staining and light pitting midway down its length. The hammer and trigger are a dark gray-blue case-hardened patina. The frame is a dull ocher still retaining fairly sharp edges. The smooth rosewood grips rate very good with some strong original varnish, each showing a stable minor crack at their butt. Barrel seems to lock up well and the mechanism functions appropriately. 1012. **UNMARKED GERMAN SYSTEM MAUSER BOLT ACTION SCHUETZEN TARGET RIFLE** serial #3601, 10.8x49R, 30" octagon barrel with a good bore showing minor pitting its full length. The barrel is primarily a plum brown patina with some traces of original blue, minor dings and scratches from the years and some scattered light oxidation. The receiver retains about 80% original color case-hardening, the balance toning to a pewter and speckled brown patina. The triggerguard is a fancy Schuetzen style with a forward-curving single spur and a rearward-curving grip flourish, it retains some pale blue case colors. The gun is equipped with double set triggers which seem to function well, there is no provision for extractor however. The European walnut high comb target style stock features a widely flaring left-side cheekpiece. The stock rates about good overall with some good original varnish but overall dings, dents and handling marks from the years, there being a 3" re-attached chip on the right side of the receiver and another smaller chip missing ahead of the bolt handle. There is a semi-hooded front sight in place, rear sight dovetail is vacant and the diopter sight seat on the tang is empty as well. (35860-27) {C&R} (300/500)
1013. **UNMARKED GERMAN MAGAZINE SPORTING RIFLE** serial #2257, 8mm (bore measures .3210"-.3215" in grooves, lands about .309"), 23 1/2" part octagon part round barrel with a bright about excellent bore. The barreled action retains about 90% dull fading gray-blue original rust blue finish, toning also to brown, the areas of wear being the high edges and contact points, especially at muzzle and leading edge of the action. The pear-shaped bolt knob has toned primarily to gray and the bolt body and shroud are overall blued. The bottom metal has faded primarily to a gray patina with some good blue on the guard. The European walnut stock is very classic with scant schnabel tip, Oberndorf sidepanels and rounded pistolgrip. The grip is checkered and the forend is keyed and the gun features a rounded left-side cheekpiece, the stock rating very good to very good plus overall with only minor dings and handling marks from the years; a small divot missing from the schnabel. The gun is single trigger, smooth buttplate and open sight-equipped. The left receiver rail shows three 8x40 TPI drilled and tapped holes for a no-longer-present scope mount, the stock was slightly inletted for it. The full-length integral barrel rib features a sourdough front sight and three-leaf rear sight; two folding, one standing. The top of the receiver ring is lightly matted and there is some very light engraving in this area with some light geometric engraving on the barrel just ahead of this. The underside of the barrel shows crown N proofs and is "7.8 mm" marked with the left side of the receiver ring showing a powder charge of "2.75g G.B.P.". A classic German sporting magazine rifle overall, not maker marked but importer marked by Sarco. (36245-3) {C&R} (400/600)
1014. **REMINGTON NEW MODEL POLICE CARTRIDGE-CONVERTED REVOLVER** serial #14075, .38 cal. RF, 6 1/2" octagon barrel with a very good bore which shows strong evident rifling but with some minor pitting. The metal surfaces are an overall tarnished pewter gray patina showing some evidence of a light cleaning, scattered light pinprick pitting and a handful of light dings and handling marks here and there; the triggerguard has toned to a goldenrod patina. The smooth two-piece walnut grips rate about very good, also lightly cleaned, showing some nice grain. They are undersized in a couple areas and do not fit the frame precisely, they are un-numbered. Frame and barrel are numbered alike, the cylinder and its rear cover piece are conversion-numbered to each other, 2129. The rear of the hammer spur has broken off, just a small piece; the loading lever pivot screw is no longer present and has been replaced with a rivet during the period of use (there are numerous tool marks surrounding this rivet on the frame) and the action will not cock, ergo the cylinder will not index nor does it lock up. Still an honest antique Remington cartridge conversion certainly worthy of some mechanical attention. (36258-55) {ANTIQUÉ} (250/450)
1015. **SMITH & WESSON MODEL 1 1/2 FIRST ISSUE REVOLVER** serial #20512, .32 RF, 3 1/4" ribbed octagon barrel with a good-very good bore which shows evident rifling but with minor pitting its full length. The metal surfaces are primarily a deep tarnished pewter and brown patina showing some scattered light pitting and numerous light handling marks or light scratches from the years. There are some generous traces of original blue, perhaps 15% on the barrel with the frame retaining near 20%. The smooth rosewood grips rate about very good, the left grip primarily devoid of finish but the right grip showing much original finish. The grips are stamp-numbered to the gun, the barrel and frame are assembly numbered alike, the cylinder is assembly numbered alike as well, its marking barely visible due to the light pitting on its face. Barrel-to-frame fit is slightly loose but the gun seems to function well mechanically. (36258-44) {ANTIQUÉ} (300/500)
1016. **SMITH & WESSON NO. 1 THIRD ISSUE REVOLVER** serial #68892, .22 RF, 3 3/16" ribbed round barrel with a near very good bore which shows evident rifling but with minor pitting its full length. The metal surfaces are primarily a dull gun metal gray with speckling of some soft brown oxidation, also showing some scattered light pinprick pits, most prevalent in the flash areas of frame and cylinder. The smooth birdshead rosewood grips rate about very good with much original varnish but also overall minor dings and handling marks, they are stamp-numbered to the gun. Barrel-to-frame fit is somewhat tenuous as the catch does not hold the barrel closed if any pressure is put on it. The mechanism seems to function well although the cylinder over-times slightly. A very good example overall of the standard model third issue No. 1. (36387-40) {ANTIQUÉ} (250/450)
1017. **SMITH & WESSON NO. 1 THIRD ISSUE REVOLVER** serial #16682, .22 RF, 3 3/16" ribbed round barrel with a good bore which shows evident rifling but with pitting its full length. The barrel and cylinder are primarily a dull tarnished pewter gray with speckling of some soft brown oxidation and some lightly scattered pits, more prominent on the cylinder. The frame is more of a plum brown patina with some toning to pewter, showing some generous traces of original blue on the frame flats, perhaps 5% remaining. The smooth birdshead rosewood grips rate good plus to near very good with flaking original varnish and overall minor dings and handling marks, they are stamp-numbered to the gun and "Ross" has lightly carved his name inside the right grip. Barrel-to-frame fit is good and the mechanism seems to function well. A very good example overall of the standard model third issue No. 1. (36387-38) {ANTIQUÉ} (250/450)
1018. **COLT OPEN TOP POCKET MODEL REVOLVER** serial #34989, .22 RF, 2 3/8" round barrel with a poor bore. The barrel and cylinder are a dull gun metal gray with brown oxidation speckling showing pitting on the barrel with pitting on the cylinder confined primarily to one side. The frame is a dull goldenrod patina with sharp edges and a few flakes of original silver plate hiding in the protected areas. The high spur hammer shows some remnants of a pale purplish temper with light oxidation and some light pitting at the spur. The smooth birdshead walnut grips rate about very good showing some flaking varnish and a few light dings and handling marks, they are pencil-numbered to the gun. The gun functions mechanically, albeit somewhat loosely. A good "example" piece overall for the budding Colt collector. (36387-36) {ANTIQUÉ} (200/400)
1019. **U.S. MODEL 1836 FLINTLOCK PISTOL** .54 cal. flint, 8 1/2" barrel with a lightly oxidized bore. The barrel is primarily a plum brown patina with pewter gray undertones ahead of the barrel band. There are "EB" inspectors markings on the left radius of the barrel along with the P firing proof, with a good deal of erosion and pitting in the area of the touchhole. The barrel band and sideplate, long tang buttcap and triggerplate are an overall smooth plum brown patina. The short tang between the breech and long buttcap tang is a deep blue-gray. The original triggerguard bow has broken off and a flat steel triggerguard has been rudimentarily affixed with a common hardware screw and soft solder. The original lock is missing and a British martial lock with waterproof pan and roller frizzen is in place, also incorporating a rear-sliding safety. The lockplate is an overall deep blue-gray patina with some minor pitting and is stepped at its rear with a pronounced teat, stamped "Tower" at the rebated section with the area beneath the pan showing the Royal Crown and "GR". The swiveling ramrod base has been removed and filed nearly flat; the attendant ramrod and hardware is no longer present. There is a modern dowel included which has been fitted into the rudimentarily opened ramrod channel. The lock is crisp and mechanically functional although there are moderate gaps in the original inletting between the stock and the lockplate itself. (36258-61) {ANTIQUÉ} (400/600)





1020. U.S. MODEL 1842 PERCUSSION PISTOL BY ASTON

.54 cal. percussion, 8 1/2" barrel with a moderately oxidized bore. The metal surfaces are a dark brown oxidized patina with scattered active oxidation and moderate pitting in the area of the nipple bolster. The lockplate is lightly

cleaned to a pewter gray patina as is the rudimentarily fitted hammer. The Aston & Co. marking on the lock with the Middletown address is evident but the date is no longer legible. All of the brass hardware has toned to a dark ochre patina showing evidence of tool marks and light cleaning during the period of use. The stock rates about good with overall handling marks, light and moderate dings, a few drying cracks and no remnants of any cartouche. There is moderate and heavy scorching in the area adjacent to the nipple bolster above the lock and the rear of the lockplate shows a good deal of chipping and erosion. The ramrod, swivel and its base are no longer present, the shallow dovetail on the underside of the barrel matching the patina of the rest of the iron surfaces. There is an antique oak or hickory ramrod in the channel. The hammer is rather large and has been center punched around the periphery of the square tumbler stud which protrudes through the lock, affixed with a heavy screw. Although it has been said ad nauseam with these single shot pistols, taking into account the heavy use and wear and the genuine rudimentary, but quality, fitting of the hammer, this truly does appear to be a Confederate-used example. (one writer's opinion) (36258-58) {ANTIQUE} (600/800)

1021. MERRILL BREECHLOADING CIVIL WAR CARBINE .54 cal. percussion, 22 1/8" round barrel with a poor, now worn to smooth, heavily oxidized bore. The metal surfaces are an overall oxidized deep brown and pewter patina with overall minor pitting, a few areas which may be moderate. The breech loading mechanism works properly mechanically. The lock and bolster do not fit one another completely and the hammer is missing. The brass triggerguard, buttplate and patchbox show a wire wheel cleaned patina. The barrel band is missing as is the saddlery, its bar is still in place. The stock rates fair-good showing an old cleaning which has softened all of the edges and left the metal proud; there is a moderate crack on the right side ahead of the lock and a heavy crack at the forend rearward. A tired second type Merrill carbine, an excellent parts candidate or major project for the talented restorer. (36364-13) {ANTIQUE} (300/500)



1022. U.S. MODEL 1842 PERCUSSION MUSKET BY SPRINGFIELD ARMORY


1469. INERT PRACTICE BOMB

This is a Second World War-era, possibly M38A2, 100 pound practice bomb (although it seems a little short to be an M38A2). These were filled with sand from the bottom to simulate a general purpose bomb of the same size. Rather than having the filler caps on the nose or radius of the cone, this model is much more attractive in that it more closely resembles the actual high explosive general purpose bomb of the day. Measures 35 1/2" tall, 8" in diameter with box type fins. The bomb has been painted black and rates very good plus overall. The bomb is in its original orange paint with white stripe and white stenciling. It features a seldom-encountered accessory, the original arming clip attached to the nose. A fabric tag attached to the clip reads "To Arm Remove Safety Clip". About 19 1/4" in length with semi-box-type fins showing a minor ding or dent but overall about excellent. 



The ricasso beneath the clamshell counterguard shows what appears to be to half-moon stampings and the reverse of the blade has a very rudimentary figure, perhaps a dog or a deer of some kind. 


